

# Pick 6



## Materials

- Pick 6 Game board (100 chart)
- Direction cards
- 12 Translucent chips
- 1 game piece
- Pick 6 recording sheet

## Work with a partner.

1. Place 12 chips on different numbers around the 100 chart. Put the game piece anywhere on the 100 chart.
2. Deal six Direction Cards face up. Place the remaining cards face down.

3. Use the Direction Cards to move your game piece. Try to land on a square with a chip. You can use any number of Direction Cards, from only one to all six.
4. If you land exactly on a square with a chip, pick it up and take it off the board. You can pick up only one chip during your turn.
5. Each player records each move with an equation on the Pick 6 Recording Sheet. For example, if you begin on 45 and use the cards +2, +10 and -3, you record  $45 + 2 + 10 - 3 = 54$ .
6. Place the used Direction Cards in a discard pile. Replace them with cards from the top of the deck. (If the deck is used up, shuffle and reuse the cards from the discard pile.)
7. Work together to Pick 6 chips.

## OPTIONS:

- ❖ Each player has a game piece and tries to win individually.
- ❖ Teams of two players play against another team of two.
- ❖ Whole class – teams of two against everyone else in teams of two. One team wins.
